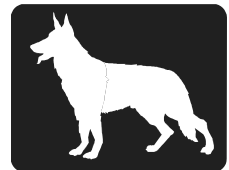

Taxi & Janelle earn their ATCH!

Here is the story in Janelle's own words:

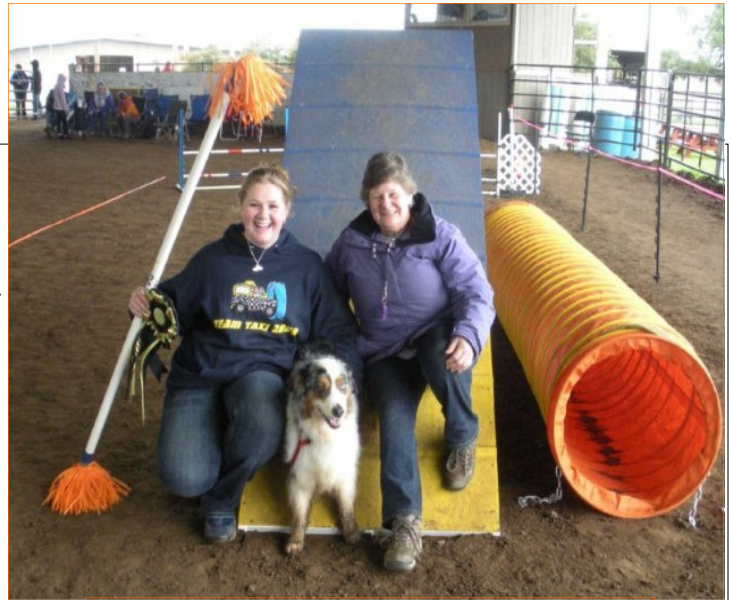
As many of you know, my journey with Taxi has been nothing short of challenging. Upon getting a dog, I knew I wanted to do agility. I had decided on getting an Australian Shepherd. I had thought I knew what I was getting myself into, but she definitely proved me wrong, the first of many times.

On April 13, 2002, we brought home our 7-week-old Blue Merle Australian Shepherd, whom we named Taxi. I was 9 years old. Now, almost 8 years later, I have never looked back on my decision to get an Aussie. I truly believe it was the best decision of my life. Sure, I've been frustrated and annoyed with her, but she is my best friend and I would do absolutely anything for her. She brought me in to the 'dog world' and I can't thank her enough for that.

Getting Taxi was the first step into making my dream of doing agility come true. Since I was a newbie in the dog world, I took literally the information I read which said you couldn't start agility until the dog was two years old. So, for the first two years of her life we did pet obedience training, and as soon as she turned two we enrolled in our first agility class. Little did I know, starting agility at two was too late. I had let all of Taxi's crazy behaviors escalate, making it almost impossible to control her. She thought that the other dogs in the class were more fun. She would have rather run around the park than do the obstacles when the leash came off. She even bolted towards one of the busiest streets in town just because she wanted to run. After this experience, I found VHOC and can't thank the people of my Thursday night class enough for being so supportive of my crazy dog and me. I knew I had my hands full, but I was willing to do whatever it took to have a successful agility dog.

I persevered and learned how to use her craziness to my advantage. We spent a full year training and when we entered our first show, I took the leash off of her and she ran straight out of the ring. I knew she wasn't perfect, but I was so embarrassed. People inside and outside the ring were laughing at me instead of trying to help me get her back. I was crying, but I thought to myself that this was my dream, and nothing was going to stop me from doing it. I made up my mind up and I never gave up.

We currently compete mainly in ASCA (Australian Shepherd Club of America) agility events. I have become an active member in ASCA and formed life long friendships

with most of the people I show with on a regular basis. In 2008, Taxi and I competed in the Agility Finals at the ASCA National Specialty in Las Vegas. We went in as the Number 1 ranked junior team in the country, and emerged holding on to that title. I never imagined I would have so much success with her.

On February 26th, Taxi celebrated her 8th birthday. These last two years have been extremely different than the previous 6 years of her life. I finally feel like Taxi and I are a team; that she actually wants to listen to me, rather than me hoping she will listen. More often than not now, Taxi listens for the 45 seconds per run that she has to. It seems, not just to me but also to everyone who sees me show on a regular basis, that Taxi and I have finally 'clicked.' We know how to read each other and when one of us is just a little bit "off", things go wrong.

On February 21st, 5 days before she turned 8, Taxi and I achieved our ASCA Agility Trial Championship (ATCH). We had been working towards this for about two years, but have been really pushing for it the last 6 months. In order to complete this highest ASCA Agility title, you need Elite titles in the Regular, Jumpers, and Gamblers classes plus 20 extra Q's in Regular and 10 extra in the other two. Since the beginning of June, Taxi and I have earned more than 30 Q's; an outstanding number for the dog who at first, very few people believed in. I am extremely proud of all we have accomplished. Getting our ATCH was definitely the cherry on top of our entire journey. —Janelle Farkas

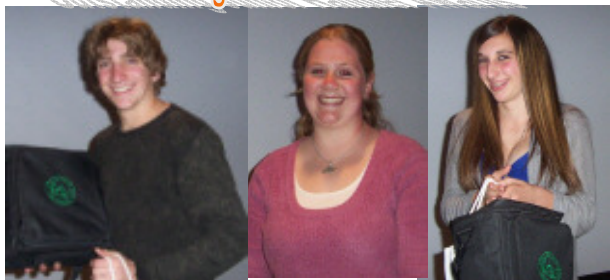

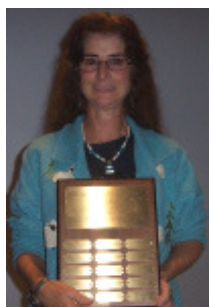

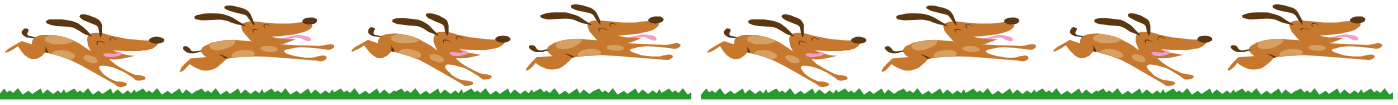

LA City to Pursue Unlicensed Dogs

The Los Angeles City Council has voted to utilize the Department of Water and Power's customer database to identify those households with dogs in order to enforce their dog licensing requirements. According to recent news reports, the city intends to send a letter to those residences where dogs are said to be living and if the property owner does not respond to the letter then an animal control officer will visit the home.

U.S. Senate Passes Resolution in Honor of AKC's 125 Years of Good Works for All Dogs

[Wednesday, February 24, 2010]

Senate Resolution 393 Joins Earlier House of Representatives Resolution 160

The American Kennel Club® (AKC), the nation's largest and only not-for-profit all-breed dog registry, is pleased to announce that in honor of its 125th anniversary, the United States Senate passed SR 393 yesterday in recognition of AKC's many years of contributions to responsible dog owners and breeders across America.

Introduced by Senator Kay Hagen (D-NC) and Senator Richard Burr (R-NC), this measure has now passed both the House and Senate, giving formal national and congressional recognition to AKC and dedication to its mission of promoting responsible dog ownership through public education programs and protecting the rights of all dog owners for continued enjoyment of their companions.

Representative David Price (D-NC) pioneered a similar resolution supported by 53 co-sponsors in the House of Representatives, HCR 160, which passed on a roll call vote of 419-0 in conjunction with AKC's 125th Anniversary, 9/17/2009.

"We feel incredibly privileged to be recognized by the United States Congress for the work we've been doing for more than a century," said AKC President and CEO Dennis Sprung. "The AKC plans to continue its good works, most recently donating \$25,000 from the AKC CAR Canine Support and Relief Fund – which has given out more than \$3 million to date – to the United States Police Canine Association in support of the search and rescue K-9s that saved lives in Haiti."

AKC and its state federations support reasonable laws that protect the rights of dog owners and breeders while ensuring the integrity of the purebred dog and the welfare of all dogs. The AKC's policies and positions are well-publicized and include inspecting its own breeders; zero tolerance for neglect and abuse; and recognizing the obligations of dog owners to abide by clean-up ordinances, leash laws, nuisance laws and other reasonable regulations.
